Under construction

John 2.13-22 Lent 3

Jesus overturning the tables in the Temple is a shocking act but seems nothing compared to what he says next. The Temple was believed to be a space where heaven touched earth, but Jesus speaks of destroying it and rebuilding it in three days. However, Jesus isn't speaking about the physical Temple, but his body. Jesus signals that his death and resurrection makes the whole world into the Temple of God.

This week we explore what we need and don't need to be church.

Prepare your children's session

Read Bible notes on WEB.

As people thought the Temple was needed to worship God, so we often have fixed ideas of what is needed to 'be' the church. What does 'church' mean for you? What do we need, to be church? What don't we need, to be church?

During this session, encourage the children to think of the church as the body of people gathered to worship Jesus rather than the building it meets in.

Provide the following play materials for very young children throughout the session: play money and purses.

Gather

Use the song, prayer and activity to gather the group and introduce the theme. (5 mins)

Sing to the tune: Hickory dickory dock

Invite everyone to take a building block. As they are named in the prayer, invite them to add their block to help build a wall.

Build a temple

You will need: building blocks, e.g. wooden bricks or Lego™.

- Give the children a few minutes to design and build a temple, either individually or working together.
- Talk about what they have created. What do they think a temple is used for? What does a temple look like?

And then the Jews there demanded of him, 'What miraculous sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?' And Jesus answered them, 'Destroy this Temple, and I will raise it in three days.' They laughed. 'It's taken forty-six years to build this Temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?!' But after the resurrection, the "three days" began to make sense! 8
