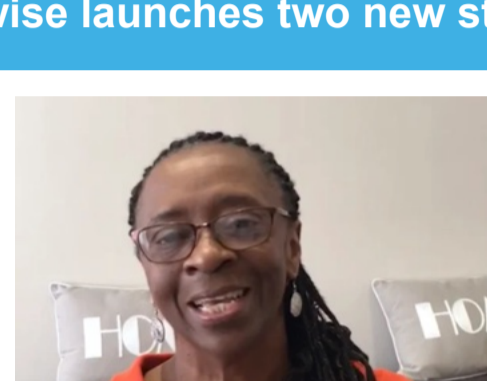
Christian Aid Week

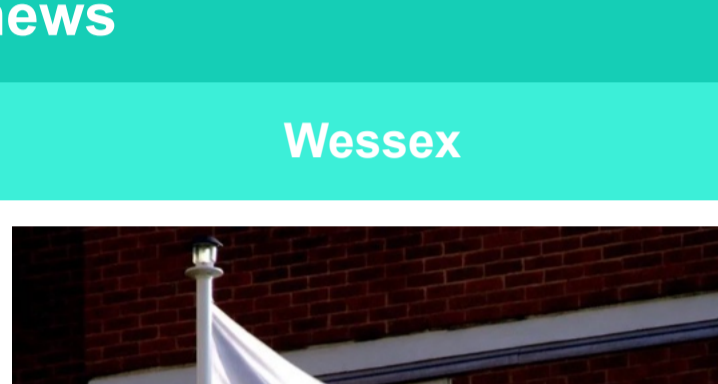

National Synod of Wales



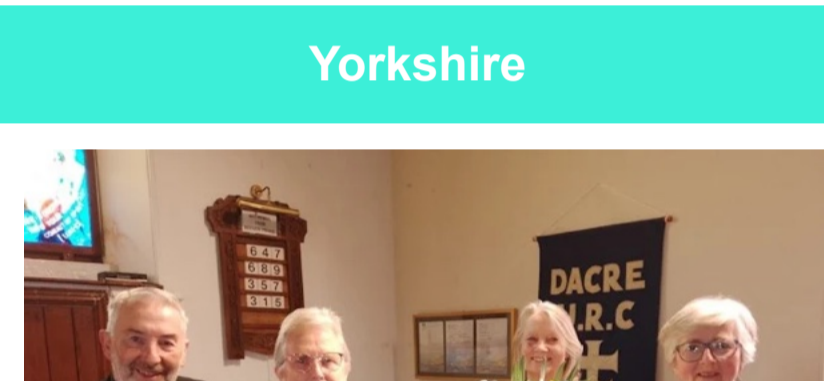

Yorkshire



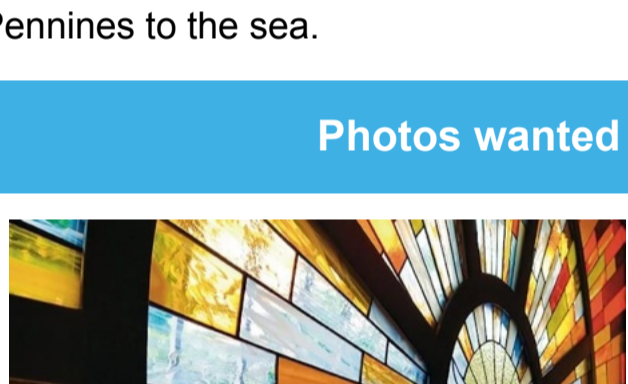
